



- The Address, v.1-2
 - -"To the angel of the church..."
 - -"He that holds the seven stars in His right hand..."
 - -"He that walks in the midst of the seven golden lamp stands..."
 - -"I know your works..."

- The Good, v.2-3, 6
 - -They toiled, labored
 - Taught the Word, did not grow weary
 - -Patience
 - Through trials they were patient, endured
 - Patience is learned, not taught
 - -Cannot bear those that are evil
 - Do not tolerate sin, or those in sin
 - Stand up for the truth of righteousness

- The Good, v.2-3, 6
 - -Have tested so-called apostles, found them to be liars
 - Were able to judge based on the Word
 - -Have borne through trials
 - Were willing to bear (II Tim. 3:12)
 - -Hate the deeds of the Nicolaitans
 - Hated the deeds, not the people
 - Attempted to control others by religion

- The Bad, v.4,5
 - -Had left their first love
 - Instead of zeal, love for Christ motivating their actions, they had become self-serving in their motivations

- -Had need of repentance
 - Shows that attitudes and motivations can be condemned

- The Bad, v.4,5
 - -Had need of remembering the way they were at the start
 - Have the zeal of a new convert, motivated out of a desire to please God

- The Conclusion, v.5,7
 - -The Consequence of not Repenting
 - Christ will remove their candlestick
 - -Will not dwell in the light, will be condemned
 - -We cannot just "go through the routines" Mt. 15:8

- The Conclusion, v.5,7
 - -The Motivation to Change
 - Eat of the tree of life, paradise of God
 - -Eat of the tree living forever
 - -Paradise of God Where we will get to live forever with God
 - »Compare Garden of Eden
