The Implications of Baptism

- I. The One Baptism is the means by which God adds us to only One Church/Body**
 - A. Eph. 4:4-5; 1:22-23; I Cor. 1:13**
 - B. Church only used two ways: 1) universal body, 2) local body...denominations fail on both counts**
 - C. One cannot be taught to be a Catholic in a Baptist church – One cannot be a member of the body of Christ by being baptized in some other religious organization that doesn't teach truth**

The Implications of Baptism

II. No “racism”, “sexism”, or partiality in “Christianity” – Be unified

A. Gal. 3:27-29; I Cor. 12:13

B. There is no distinction made of color or nationality in Jesus Christ

C. While there are distinctions made in the roles of men and women, both are of equal importance; equal ≠ same

The Implications of Baptism

III. Old Law has ended – Col. 2:11-16

A. We are circumcised in baptism

B. Forgiveness is obtained in baptism,
separated from that which was
“contrary to us”

The Implications of Baptism

I. The One baptism is how we are added to the One Body/Church

II. There is no partiality in the body – all are equal

III. The Old Law has ended

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
