IV. Demands change of life regarding sin –

A. Rom. 6:1-2, 4, 6, 11, 17-18

B. We died to sin – in baptism

C. When we were baptized, our life was supposed to change with regards to sin- it was to be rejected

The Implications of Baptism

V. It is the dividing line between being lost and saved – I Pet. 3:20-21

A. *Antitupos* – “striking against”

B. Type = water/flood saved Noah, not ark

C. Antitype = water baptism, as water serves as a dividing line between sinful and righteous

The Implications of Baptism

VI. It is a work of faith and obedience – Gal. 3:26-27

A. We are only sons of God through faith...not everyone is a child of God

B. The means by which I become a child of God is through baptism
