### III. Answers: Actions of others

- 1. God will not interfere with the free will of man to choose right or wrong, good or evil Lev. 26, (I Tim. 2:3-4, Acts 17:30, II Pet. 3:9, Ezek. 33:11); Gen. 50:20
  - A. Therefore the innocent will always suffer for the choices, and often the consequences, of those who do evil
  - B. What would we have God do? Stop people from doing anything bad, ever?
